AIC Outreach Spreading Across the Country... and into EVG!

When the world closed down on Friday the 13th, 2020, our barbershop communities closed down as well. Unable to gather to sing, socialize, and perform, our choruses and quartets began to fade into the background. Understanding the critical role of

singing & performing a play in our lives, the Association of International Champions (AIC) asked, 'what can we do?' The results were a vital Livestream AIC Show in July 2020, a phenomenal Holiday Film production in December 2020, and the launch of the AIC Outreach Fund.

Conceived not only as a way to bring Champion quartet performances to chapters & districts suffering the financial hardship of 2020/2021, the AIC Outreach Fund went a step further. At the insistence of the AIC, itself, the Fund enables chapters & districts to bring in champs to perform *and* to engage in outreach in the local chapter/district communities, outreach that is tailored to each specific community's needs. The idea was so compelling that two-time Int'l Quartet Champion, John Miller & his wife, Sharon, committed a \$50,000 Challenge to the barbershop world to make dollars from the fund available to as many organizations as possible. https://www.harmonyfoundation.org/aic Currently, approximately \$120,000 has been pledged against the Millers' original \$50,000.

Ken Robinson came to the Boise Chordsmen in what some might say was unusual. Ken sang for a short time with the Twin Falls Barbershop chorus, way back when Burt Huish was there. Later after moving to Boise, sang for a very short time with the Boise Chordsmen some 25+ years ago.

Ken's wife worked for a jewelry store in the early 2000's. A mailman that many, if not most of his customers knew him as the singing mailman. One day when Marilyn and the mailman were talking she mentioned that her husband had sung barbershop. He mentioned an upcoming show, and she in turned told Ken that they had to go. They came to the show, and Marilyn introduced him to Ken. And Ken was invited to the next chorus rehearsal.

At that time 4th Dimension was struggling with their current baritone with issues that need not repeated. At that next chorus rehearsal the current bari did not show up, so 4D asked Ken to sing with them at the break. The next week the current bari again failed to show up, and again 4D asked Ken to sing with them in the hallway at the break. We also asked one of our most trusted basses to listen in and he informed us that the sound with Ken was extraordinarily full compared to our current configuration. That was enough for us. Ken became a member of the 4th Dimension in 2004.

Ken filled our quartet's sound with his powerful sound, and yet gentle sound when needed. He also filled the quartet with so much joy. His big 'ol laugh will linger with us forever.

He, along with the other members of the quartet would give Ken Leonard a hard time every time he left town and there would be no rehearsal. And when Ken L got sick and could not sing for a while they all stuck with him. And no matter the reason or

length of time we were apart Ken would always tell us, "You guys don't know how much I've missed this."

Ken loved music. But he really LOVED barbershop. Probably because in barbershop the quartet sounds so empty without a baritone. As far as song choice, Ken was the easiest to please. We could play a recording of a song, or I could sing a melody line and he would like it. "Let's sing it!" he would say. It didn't matter if it was Skidamarink A Dink A Dink, he would have sung it and sung it with gusto.

Ken loved our quartet so very much. He really loved the road trips to contests. Marilyn told us he would pack his clothes a week early.

Ken Robinson passed away on September 23rd, 2021. Now, 4th Dimension is forever changed, the quartet will never be the same. We will be so empty without Ken. "Ken Robinson, you just don't know how much you are missed."
