At any rate, this is the start of an important conversation. It can give you clues to what you can, should, or need to do to improve the barbershop experience for your chapter.

Teach your board members to do the same thing. It will very quickly pay dividends...I promise you.

Planning, Planning, Planning: Tis the Season

Mixed vs. "All Voices" Ensembles Notes from Blair Brown's HU class

With Everyone In Harmony, BHS chapters have created new singing ensembles that include men and women, often calling them "Mixed" ensembles to differentiate them from our men's choruses. The term seems much less common outside the barbershop world given that such ensembles have existed for centuries and are considered the norm. A more common label is to call them "SATB" ensembles, identifying them by their voice parts.

In a Harmony University class taught by Blair Brown (lead of Double Date quartet), she identified the term "All Voice" as the preferred term as opposed to "Mixed." The term frees us from any specific gender expectations for participants, allowing cis-gender males and females, and LGBTQI+ singers to join on equal terms. All Voice ensembles can be SSAA, TTBB, and SATB depending only on the capabilities and interests of the ensembles and singers involved.

All Voice ensembles at this year's International included 3rd place chorus Gotham, our own PDX Voices, and 9th place quartet Smoke Ring.

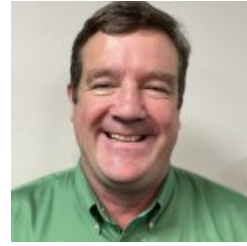
CHAPTER LEADERS

CYBER RISK MANAGEMENT

for Chapters

As a Chief Financial Officer, I help organizations manage risk, including cyber risks. There are basic common sense steps that can minimize this growing threat. As a chapter leader using your personal computer for chapter business, consider adopting the following policies.

Delete suspicious or unexpected emails: Cyber thieves run “phishing” email scams to trick the unsuspecting into providing credit card or other personal information.

Check where the email is coming from by hovering your cursor over the address – it could be a foreign country address (e.g., “.ru” is from Russia). If you weren’t expecting an email from the sender, it’s probably fake. And whenever in doubt, call the sender.

Protect passwords: Cyber thieves that are able to gain access to a chapter officer’s personal computer will look for a list of passwords, sometimes kept in an Excel spreadsheet. To thwart this, maintain a handwritten list or use a password-locking service to store your passwords. Change your passwords frequently, at least quarterly.

Ignore unexpected download instructions: File downloads can include malware that can give cyber thieves access to your computer. Don’t download any program that you did not request. Also, don’t “click through” on hyperlinks embedded in an email.

REVIEW, REVIEW, REVIEW

it's August and things slow down. Preparation is underway for fall conventions and Christmas. But it's also a great month to review your plan, your goals, your accomplishments, and your setbacks.

Review your Marketing plan. Does your action plan remain the same or does it need modification?

Did the first seven months go as planned? If it did, **Celebrate**, if it didn't, acknowledge the mistakes and work on plans for improvement for the future. Take time to check in with your leadership team and see if they are on track. How did your membership help or hinder your events? Do they need more buy-in?

How are you shaping up for the final four months of the year? Do you have a team in place? Is the Christmas show completed? Are you on track or behind? Perhaps you should check in with the Christmas and Singing Valentine chairs and encourage them to stay on task.

If you have a two-year term, look ahead to next year for improvements!

Review your SWOT report to see if your Strengths and Opportunities still are the same. Has there been a shift in the market? Does it look like all is well, or do you need to tweak it? Have your threats changed? Have you improved your weaknesses and made them strengths?

There are hundreds of trivial things to consider before they become MASSIVE. The end of July and the beginning of August are opportunities to see if you are on track, or if you need to adjust.

Building the Marketing Plan and the SWOT analysis is "upfront work", once in place all you need to do is steer the ship. If you built a two or three-year marketing plan you can "cruise" for a little while, but you can never stop striving for innovative ideas

EVERYONE ISN'T EVERYONE

Everyone likes to read! Everyone uses their phone for communications! Everyone is a visual learner! Everyone hears a message once and locks it into their memory!

Every sentence above is false. As individuals we have varying skills, learning styles, and personalities. This means we learn and retain information individually.

Some key thoughts:

1. Communication to your group relies on learning styles because you're "teaching your message."
2. Information requires repetition to become memorable.
3. It is wise to duplicate your message using multiple platforms. This allows you to use oral, visual, and written information for different learning styles.

There is a fine line between customer service and obnoxiousness so don't over-communicate. There is a learning technique called space - repetition which recognizes space between your messages allows the mind to absorb the information.

Helpful ideas:

1. Get to know your members personally.
2. Use members communication preferences.
3. Use a multi-channel approach.
4. Automate basic communications.
5. Be sure not to over-communicate.

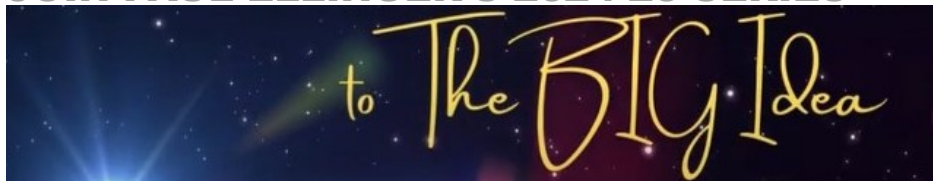
