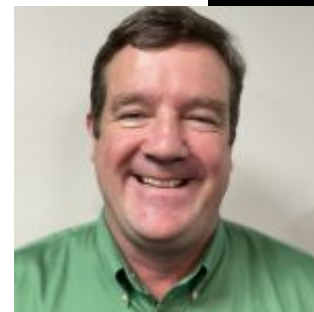
## POLECAT 1 CHALLENGE 2024

**Step 3:** When your show is approved the [Communications Director](#) Greg Kronlund will contact you for show information and poster.

**Step 4:** Approved shows are added to the District Calendar, and released to GreenSheet, Timbre, Facebook and Instagram to alert the District about your show. Remember for distribution all shows and event information is sent to the [communications](#) email.

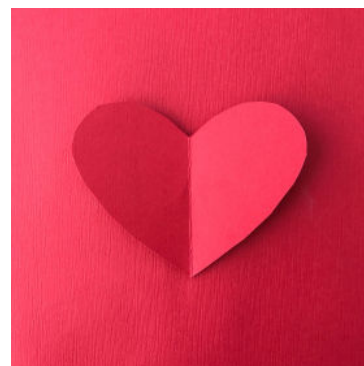
## SINGING VALENTINES

### First 5 Steps

We're notorious for planning singing Valentine's on February 1st. A better idea: start planning in late October-early November.

#### Pre-Planning:

Make sure you have a **Singing Valentine Chairperson**, **Quartet Wrangler**, and **Logistics Manager**.



**Chairperson** oversees the event; **Quartet Wrangler** ensures quartets (especially pick-up qtets) are practicing and functioning as an ensemble. **Logistics Manager** works to find the most efficient and effective use of quartet time.

**Step 1:** build your quartets. Remember to sell the benefit and fun of this event. A chance to perform, celebrate someone's love, and to raise funds for the chapter. Announce delivery dates and hours to allow members to check for availability. Can you stretch this into a multiple day event...

**Step 2:** get them singing together and planning their Valentine songs. Allow quartets to choose songs beyond "**The Story of the Rose**" and "**Let Me Call You Sweetheart**."

**Step 3:** build time into your meetings for quartets to practice.

**Step 4:** start building, posters, brochures, outside advertising, community outreach, and create or update your order forms.

**Step 5:** decide sales dates and delivery times. When do you start and end. Is this a multi-day event? Know your pricing. Keep the price point at a level your community will support. Consider economic trends and select your prices carefully.

## CHAPTER DEVELOPMENT

The upcoming holiday season is probably the very best time of year to expose your community to the barbershop style of acappella singing. Many choruses are having a community chorus or a holiday Sing Sing Sing program. Both have proven very successful at building community awareness and gaining new members. Why? Because just about everyone loves, and loves to sing Christmas carols.

Even if your chorus is small and won't be able to put on a Christmas show, you can still perform around town, at the local town square or mall, for service organizations, or for the community tree lighting and senior centers. The intent is not to raise money, but to build community awareness. As you see audience members singing along, take the time afterwards to engage the audience as individuals. Invite them to your next rehearsal. Get their contact information to be able to keep them informed about your performances and follow up with them about attending a rehearsal.

## Chapter Development ideas, pulled from the Sept 2017 Harmonizer.

**Train and develop a musical leadership.** Make sure your chapter is fostering educational opportunities. You'd be surprised how many choruses have a director who never intended to be the director. Smaller chapters can be especially susceptible to this. If your director moves, quits, or retires, do you have a plan? I have visited chapters where the new director is in the position because he was a great chapter president, or because he was the only charter member in the chorus, or because he was the best singer. Foster assistant director(s) and future section leaders. Take time for quartets each week. The BHS hosts numerous programs such as Harmony University, CDWI, and even online musicianship training.

**Foster an environment of openness and inclusiveness.** Is your chapter welcoming? Can anyone visit? Are you easy to locate? If you had a guest walk through your door, how long would it take for someone in your chapter to greet them, offer a handshake, and give them a guest book? Although these steps seem obvious to some, an open and happy chapter is a guest-friendly chapter. Is your leadership open to trying new ideas? Can it accept criticism? Does your board listen to the concerns of the general membership?

**Conclusion** Many of our smaller chapters provide a fulfilling experience for their members, musically, socially, and in their desire to give back to the community. No chapter is perfect, and even the best-run chapters can always find areas for improvement. However, you will find that all successful chapters (whatever their size) are successful because they planned to be successful. I hope these 10 tips can inspire some discussion and planning that can help your chapter provide a better experience for its current and future members!
