2024 HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE—BOB ROBSON



Bob Robson joined BHS in 1969, he is now a 50+ year member. He has sung with the Stampede City Chorus (18yrs), and currently is a member of the Calgary Foothills Chapter and sings in the Acappella Road Chorus.

Bob has been a "guardian" of the needs of our district and our members in the various positions he has held as he works with other district leaders. He also has recruited and developed many people over the years to serve in Evergreen District leadership roles. Many of those people will agree with this statement, "Bob is encouraging, fair, consistent, accepting of different ideas, and allows his teams to try new things."

At the chapter level, Bob has served his chapters over the years on committees and in chapter leadership roles. As a member of the music team he has regularly taught tags, led warm-ups, acted as an assistant Director (including stepping in for Randy Peters at Division at the last minute when Randy Peters took ill the day before contest), and a mentor for other assistant Directors and Section leaders. Spent time as baritone and as tenor section leader.

At the Division level, Bob's organized multiple Director Training Seminars, Division III Harmony Colleges for all of the Division Chapters, COTS, and organized quartet coaching sessions in Calgary with EVG District Quartets

He's also been very involved in helping EVG by serving in many different roles: District VP of Music and Performance, Evergreen District Board Member-at-large, Evergreen District Director of Chorus Director Development, as Evergreen Executive VP and in 2015-16 Bob was our Evergreen District President. Bob is a retired Professional Geologist and worked in the oil patch in Calgary. He graduated from the University of Calgary. He's been married to Diane for more than 50 years and they have 2 grown boys and 6 grandchildren.

Bob's Reply:

It is truly an honor to become part of the Evergreen Hall of Fame.

It has been 20 years since Bruce Foreman (bless his recently departed soul) asked me to be a part of the Evergreen Leadership Team.

This was the start of realizing that the world of barbershop is much bigger than our own little chapter and our own little back yard. I spent 35 years singing with my friends in Calgary and attending District events once or twice a year without really thinking that such events had to be organized by someone. Then with Bruce's encouragement I figured it was time to 'give back' to the District.

What an excellent way to ensure that all of the District (the largest geographical District in the Barbershop Harmony Society) can share in the Contest experience and the musical talents of all of the competitors. Thanks to the organizers who made this happen and to the District Board for taking the risk to try this.

FROM OUR DISTRICT REP FOR CONTEST AND JUDGING (DRCJ)

Well, from a participation standpoint, the 2024 district contest was a huge success! Again, we had 37 quartets and 16 choruses take part. There were fewer problems encountered by yours truly, but just a week before the contest we still had a few quartets with less than four songs in their repertoire and 1-2 quartet members with expired BHS memberships. (Everything that needed to be completed in order to compete was finally settled by the first day of the contest.)



Obviously, it was a *very* long contest, and it was necessary to start as early as we did, if not for any other reason other than not making quartets have feedback sessions starting at 12:30am!

But as things stand now, this won't be the case in 2025. Because access to the venue is restricted, the quartet semifinals on Friday will start much later than this past contest. The ripple effect is that we'll be forced to reduce the number of quartets competing in the contest. (The exact number is still TBD, but probably not fewer than 24.) So, questions naturally occur: Who gets to be in the contest? How will it be determined? These are the questions I'm asking myself, as well as What's the fairest way to have a smaller number of quartets? And what about new quartets? Will there be any room for them to compete?

Once I know exactly what time we can start the semifinals, I can determine exactly how many quartets will be in the contest. That's the easy part. But who gets to sing is the hard part. I'll keep you posted as the process moves along.

(On a side note, EVG is looking into the possibility of re-establishing division contests in the spring of 2026, but what will that look like is still TBD.)

ARE YOU READY TO LEAD? By: BILL HICKMAN, EVG District President

Are You Ready to Lead?

Are you ready to lead your chapter? In previous **Timbre** articles I have posed several questions for chapter leaders. Since you now have identified your chapter leadership team for the coming year, I think a review of these questions will help you focus.

How do you lead your chapter? This question was posed to get you to think about an uncomfortable truth. Everyone in your chapter is a volunteer. We cannot hire or fire our volunteers, and we do not have the power of the purse to offer financial incentives. Given that, how can we influence or inspire them to do what needs to be done? The answer is to build trust and to communicate effectively. To help you with this I offered a couple of leadership tools:



Tool #1 – Ask Questions and Listen to the Answers. As chapter leaders we cannot possibly know how to solve every problem, nor can we be expected to even understand all the problems. I believe the answers to both can be found in your members. Ask them questions and really listen to their answers.

Tool #2 - What's going well? What's not going well? What could be done better? This set of questions is a powerful tool because it asks open-ended questions. These begin real conversations.

What do we want? What do we need? These questions were intended to help you begin serious discussions with the other leaders in your chapter about goals.

What is your purpose? Every successful team, be it a sports team, a business team, or a chapter team, has a sense of shared purpose. The purpose itself doesn't matter. What **DOES** matter is that you **have** one and that it is shared by all the members of **your** team.

Donor's Choice:

Our Donor's Choice program is a great way to facilitate support to many segments of singing communities through one gift. When donors make unrestricted annual financial gifts to Harmony Foundation, they have the **choice to dedicate portions of that funding** to their District, Chapter, and/or Brigade while at the same time helping Harmony Foundation support the other barbershop programs through our grant cycle as well. This allows **you to focus on singing**, fellowship, and embracing all the benefits of singing that are at the core of our mission while maximizing our expertise to work for you!



Program Guidelines

Twice each year, we send a check or EFT representing designations for your respective District, Chapter, and/or Brigade from donors who appreciate the vital work at the local and regional levels to enrich lives through singing. Generous donors have the option to designate up to 30 percent of their contributions to the District, Chapter, and/or Brigade of their choice.

The program is administered under the following guidelines:

- The Foundation accounts for all Donor Choice pledges to Districts, Chapters, and Brigades.
- Cash received between July 1 and December 31 is distributed the following March and mailed directly to the District, Chapter, or Brigade Treasurer.
- Cash received between January 1 and June 30 is distributed the following September and will be distributed either by postal mail or during the fall district conventions to chapter representatives. Brigade checks will be mailed to the Treasurer.
- Checks will be issued only if Donor Choice designations total \$25 or greater for the District, Chapter, or Brigade. Otherwise, the distribution is held until the total reaches \$25.

If a chapter has lost its 501(c)3 designation, the funds will be held until the status is resolved.

In addition to the check or EFT, a list of individuals who have contributed through the Donor Choice option is included. For confidentiality reasons, we will not reveal the amounts these donors contributed. If donors wish to disclose the amount of their donations, they may do so at their discretion. We strongly encourage you to use this opportunity to recognize them in a respectful way in which the donor remains free from any future pressure yet is recognized for their choice to include you in their philanthropic partnership with Harmony Foundation.

Harmony Foundation reserves the right to make the final decision regarding Donors Choice distributions.

This year's female clinician was Caitlin Castelino, a 24 year member of Sweet Adelines International, Master 600 Director of Diablo Vista Chorus and sings baritone for International Champion Quartet, Love Notes (2014). She also created and directs The Starlettes, a chorus comprised of past Rising Star champions. This year's male clinician was arranger, singer and chorus director Dan Wessler. Dan directs the 2024 BHS Gold Medal Chorus, Westminster. He writes arrangements for BHS contest, as well as for general show performance, having many groups singing his arrangements.

Participating youth and directors learned to sing in the Barbershop style as well as good vocal production. One of the festival highlights is the school directors singing in the "Teacher's Chorus" where they sing for the kids along with Tofu Concern and a couple of teaching quartets, Soundbyte and Clover. The festival wrapped up each evening with the male and female choruses singing as well as a combined song directed by Dan Wessler, along with school quartet's, some Chordsmen and Star Harmony quartets, the Chordsmen and finally Tofu Concern.

LEVERAGING ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE (AI)

Using Artificial Intelligence in Your Chapter

Chapter leaders are always looking for tools to help the chapter run more efficiently. What is Artificial Intelligence and how can we use it?

Defining Artificial Intelligence

Forms of artificial Intelligence have actually been around for decades. "Machine learning" uses models or algorithms that have been "trained" on large datasets to create human-like functions.



What's new is generative AI models, which can seemingly create new content. Using Large Language Models, applications such as ChatGPT can "predict" and compile words and sentences, based on past usage. AI models can also be trained to produce images.

Leveraging Al

The ability to generate a first draft can give chapter leaders a "head start" when putting together documents and avoid hiring an expensive lawyer. Al can provide outlines and checklists that will spur ideas. Traditional internet searches usually just yield links to websites.




- <u>Custom Images</u>— typed "create image for barbershop chapter recruiting new members" and got this Everyone in Harmony image (example on previous page):
- <u>Business plans</u> CoPilot (free version) search on "sample business plans barbershop harmony chapter" produced excellent outline and also referenced the BHS sample business plan.
- <u>Grant proposals</u> "barbershop chapter grant proposal" yielded outline for writing compelling proposal plus link to BHS "Grant Program Development Manual."
- Donor emails "barbershop chapter donor email" generated editable email for a repeat donor.

Risks of Al

Al presents risks for chapter leaders.

- *Hallucinations* synthesized ungrounded text. ChatGPT makes up stuff. A linguistics professor created nonsensical phrase "argumentative dipthongzation," presented it to ChatGPT, which spewed out four paragraphs, including entirely fabricated mention of person first credited with using the term.
- Infringement authors of original content may have copyrighted their work. Content "generated" by ChatGPT could be considered a "derivative work."
- Better phishing scams Bad actors are using generative AI. Fraudulent emails to chapters can better mimic the "voice" of the organization.

Lesson learned: "You never know when the seed you plant will bear fruit, provided you keep watering it along the way."

Indeed, it's important to have some big events each year, but many times it's those little events along the way that make the difference in raising awareness of your chorus... if you aren't afraid to casually invite that conversation to whomever might listen.

One man replied, "But we were told gold's so abundant that it practically jumps into your pockets!"






"After getting a cancer diagnosis about two years ago, Don pulled back from a number of his barbershop activities. He sold his home, and is now in a care facility.

'CHAPTER DEVELOPMENT' AND 'MEMBERSHIP' By: BOB THOMAS, Chapter Development Director


The Difference between "Chapter Development" and "Membership."

To some, "Membership" is greeting guests and organizing one or two guest nights a year.

To me "Membership" involves <u>everything</u>, because everything impacts your membership.

Therefore, "Chapter Development." The membership portion involves recruiting, orientation and retention, which is a lot if done well and requires a team.

The **Chapter Development VP** needs to communicate with the marketing person to ensure that they are targeting the right audience with a consistent message and promoting the chorus for sing outs. To keep new and current members engaged the VP works with the



director and music team, to keep chapter meetings organized, with fun and variety. An organization singers want to be a part of. Is the repertoire super large and overwhelming for newcomers? Does the chapter introduce new songs to keep older members interested?

The VP can also encourage and help organize social events where members can interact and have fun, involve spouses and maybe families. It's said that barbershoppers come for the singing and stay around for the camaraderie. Are members given the tools and help that they need to be better singers and performers? This is a job for the music team, but it can certainly negatively impact retention of members, if not done well.

Sometimes joining a chapter is like **jumping on a moving train**, everyone knows where the train's heading, except the new person. So having an organized system to aid a new member through their first year of membership is very important. Can you see now that everything impacts membership?

Chapter Development means helping to get the most out of the talents of each member. Healthy chapters try to have a chapter job for each member, so everyone has a little skin in the game. This also helps develop future leaders so it's easier for the board to have a succession plan, versus just asking for volunteers for positions. *Everything* affects membership.

The membership makes all decisions by vote, and a group of section representatives follow-through on those decisions. **MMM** encourages members to learn new songs to develop a changing repertoire. For many, this helps with memory issues and provides a sense of accomplishment.

It may be a different way to barbershop, but **Midday Melody Men** strongly believe their core strength is Fun, Fellowship, and Service.

When the Sing Canada Harmony Board reviewed and revised our mission last November, we worked with a facilitator to define who it is we want to serve. Over the years our scope had grown, beyond what our original intentions were. We found we were receiving requests from professional choirs, solo vocal performance students and other applications that did not follow the spirit of our intentions.

After a spirited weekend of discussion, we narrowed the focus of our education grants to a cappella harmony education:

- individuals who provide vocal music direction to choral groups
- vocal ensembles at the school and community level.
- individuals who serve at an administrative level within a community-based choral music organization, such as the Barbershop Harmony Society, Sweet Adelines International, Harmony, Incorporated, community singing organizations and school choirs.
- community-based vocal music organizations collaborating with school students to promote and foster a singing culture.

Our new online application process requires applicants to show how their request aligns with our mission and provide their own measures of success. Since implementing this renewed mission statement and application process, we are seeing more closely aligned applications across the board, which makes our job of giving grants much more efficient (and a lot more fun).

Requests from barbershop singers and chapters to promote educational activities, are aligned well with our mission statement, and we encourage you to apply for assistance with your vocal education activities. Sing Canada Harmony will continue to support barbershoppers who attend Harmony University, HCNW and other a cappella harmony education programs.

Our change in mission has resulted in more purely a cappella applications and brought our organization back to what Sing Canada Harmony had been created for: any member of an organized harmony singing music program.
