TICKET DONATIONS - SID BROWN



Hello Evergreen!

Would your Chorus like to see new faces at your shows? Well, here is one way to do just that (in the US anyway)! There is an organization that caters to Veterans and First Responders; VetTix and 1stTix. The basic premise is your Chorus would donate a number of tickets for your show or event.

VetTix and 1stTix advertise on their apps for those that are signed up and they pay a discounted rate for your show or event for up to four tickets. The reason for them charging is to fund their operation and so the person requesting tickets has a little skin in the game and are more likely to show up. They are then encouraged to post a picture and give feedback about the event on the respective website to encourage others to attend future events and to show participation.

The Boise Chordsmen donated 25 tickets for each Christmas Show to try it out. The reach for the Boise area is over 8,000 people signed up on their respective apps. I can only imagine the reach for the I-5 corridor! We had 16 people for the first night and 25 people for the second night sign up and show up for the shows.

We received very positive comments from those that took advantage of the opportunity.

Chapter Treasurer Reminders for January 2025

BHS resources: The Society provides excellent resources for new and returning chapter treasurers. Publications include the Chapter Treasurer Manual, which sets forth monthly reminders for the entire year. Make sure that your chapter treasurer has a copy.

Tax deadlines: Form 990s are not due until May 15, but Form 1099s need to be sent to individuals or quartets that received more than \$600 in 2024 by January 31.

Banking: Review the signers on the chapter bank account. Have at least two officers on the account, delete former officers from the account and change the account password. Also, make sure that excess funds are earning interest in a money market account or certificate of deposit.

Financial review 2024: Chapters are required to submit a summary review of the prior year's financial activity to BHS. Review can be performed by another chapter member or the Treasurer from another EVG District chapter.

RECRUIT BOLDLY - GREG KRONLUND



Recruit Boldly or not at all!

I've recently participated in an online conversation about Recruiting New Members. The chat members represented many countries. The discussion was lively with lots of suggestions... Here are a few observations:

1) Sometimes chapters believe potential new members need to do all the work. They need to **call you, find you, ask you** for an invitation, and **then decide** to join. That's backwards.

2) If you never leave your rehearsal space no one will know you exist.

3) The strongest recruiting tool is singing where people can hear you.

4) Places to sing: street corner, local karaoke event, Farmer's Market, parade, mall, or wherever people gather.

5) Practice inviting people to attend. When performing, look for someone singing along; that might be a good indication they're interested.

6) Take time to practice welcoming guests. Remember not to scare potential members away by pushing membership. Let them come to you by your friendliness.

7) Don't be afraid of making a mistake; trying something is better than not trying at all.

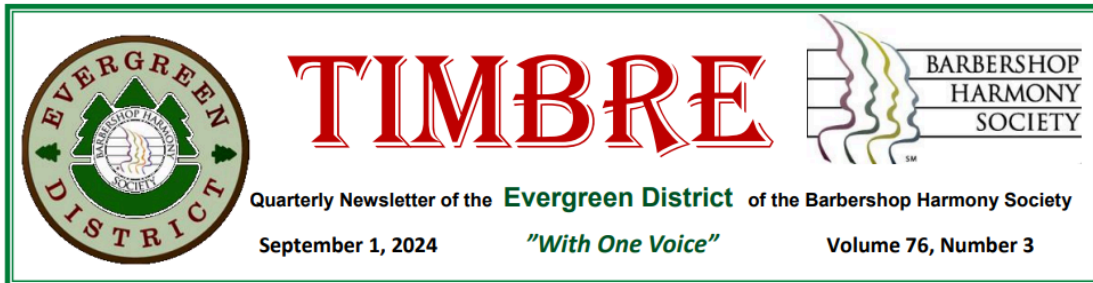
